## ***2018 Playday Rules***

- Sign up to play for the following week by the Ladies Corner in the OGA Women's notebook. The notebook will also be available during lunch. If you don't sign up on the day of play, you will be able to email your request to the captains.
- An email will be sent to all members by Sunday reminding them to sign up to play. Cut off time to sign up will be Tuesday by noon each week.
- Tee times and groupings will be emailed to all members Wednesday by 5:00 PM.
- All members should be at the clubhouse 15 minutes before the first tee time. Late sign-ups will be accommodated only if space is available.
- Upon completion of the round, all players will submit their tallied and signed scorecard with both gross and net calculated as well as days play results, then transfer that information onto the weekly PING play sheet including gross, net and day results.
- Winners of day play will be announced weekly with prizes awarded at the end of the season. A player must have an established handicap at the start of the season to qualify for year-end awards.
- Scorecards not submitted or not tallied will not be included in Days Play competition. Scorecards must be signed and attested and left at the Women's notebook on the table.
- Each foursome must keep each other's scores using 2 scorecards but turning only one in after verifying the scores.
- USGA rules shall govern all play except where amended by a local rules sheet. Local rules for Thursdays include drop zones on the other side of the hazard on holes #7, #8, #14 and #18. On regular play day always use Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) for posting on line. For days play scoring you must use the exact number of strokes you played for each hole. Mark the accurate score on your scorecard and post the ESC. There are no "gimmies"; putt out on each hole. Replace all divots, repair all ball marks on the green, and rake sand traps.
- Players shall play "ready golf" with the expectation of completing 18 holes in 4 ½ hours as a foursome. Keep up with the group in front of you. If you fall behind and there is one hole open ahead, you must pick up your pace of play.
- Out-of-bounds is defined by white stakes. Water hazards are defined by yellow stakes; lateral hazards are defined by red stakes. Green tops on hazard stakes are environmentally sensitive areas. DO NOT enter to retrieve your golf ball.
